

ANALYSIS OF THE EXPECTATIONS QUESTIONNAIRE FOR STUDENTS

DECEMBER 2015

Altogether 180 responses - on average 20 from each school

1. Why do you want to be a part of an international project?

General conclusion: Students want to be a part of an international project to meet and visit peers from other countries. They want to test their language skills in real situations. They want to contribute to the project by preparing events within their reach (posters, school visit...) not so much high tech contributions such as creating computer games and apps – they prefer playing them.

2. What do you / don't you like in English lessons?

General conclusion: Students are reluctant to traditional educational approaches, such as writing, copying, testing and evaluation or drill exercises, where teachers give them exercises on paper. They also don't enjoy speaking in front of an audience. They much prefer modern methods, such as video, listening and ICT exercises, exercises that include moving around and games and quizzes, where they have a feeling they are playing rather than learning.

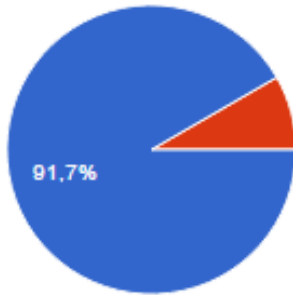

4. Connection between English / ICT / Art

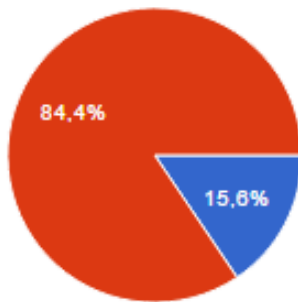
